A message from Pastor Chris

One thing I ponder as we begin another year is how we as a church community are called to follow Jesus in this season. There are some Christians that tend to look backwards longingly and remember past church experiences with fondness. The church of the past seems better than the present or future. There is nothing wrong with appreciating the past, but I personally find myself hungry for a new form of Christianity that will hold some good experiences from the past but will also change and adapt with time.

During January and February, we will be exploring images of Jesus that will help us be faithful followers of Jesus in 2025. We will explore Jesus as our Lord, Peacemaker, Friend, Healer, and Savior.

Hebrews 13 verse 8 says that "Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever." Although this is very true, Jesus also adapts himself to reach new generations with the Gospel. I wonder how Christ might relate to people today. What might he wish could change about present day Christianity?

One type of Christianity that worries me is the one that tends to approach the world with judgment and

anxiety. It is easy to look for the bad in the world and to call it sin and evil. Evil is certainly active in our world, but what if Christians spent more time looking for the good in the world and where Jesus is actively bringing about healing and change? What if we optimistically focused on the values that might improve the world like greater inclusion of all people, greater care for nature, celebration of the Arts, improving education, proper nutrition and exercise, deepening our prayer lives, kind and compassionate forms of peacemaking and justice work?

Maybe the world is better than we often think because God is active in the world. Maybe from a positive view of God and God's creation, we may have the proper perspective to address the injustices and suffering that also is active in the world. In my experience hope is necessary to motivate healing and wholeness. It is normal to have painful emotions or to feel overwhelmed by the negative things happening in our world, but as we process our sorrows in light of God's love and grace, new hope can emerge. This is the deeper truth of God's activity in the world.

I look forward to joining you in following Jesus in 2025. Let us have hope together that the future even with its challenges can lead to a deeper relationship with Jesus and a greater experience of justice, compassion, and love for all of God's creation.



The church has recently purchased a new automated external defibrillator (AED) for use by our congregation. An AED is a portable medical device used to treat sudden cardiac arrest, where a person's heart suddenly stops beating, by delivering an electric shock to restart the heart rhythm; and having an AED readily available can significantly increase the chance of survival by allowing immediate intervention from trained individuals on-site. We are looking for abled body volunteers who are willing to be trained for it's use. Please contact the office for details.

Compassion in Action



Kathryn is a new staff woman who was part of the Introduction to Mission group I (M) coached virtually this fall (new missionaries take 3 of 11 Bible classes Cru requires), who reported to her team in Asheville, NC just before the two big hurricanes hit, which cut their town off from access. The Lord gave their team tangible and gospel opportunities in their community in

ways, soon helped by Cru campus teams and Unto (Cru's humanitarian aid ministry) with both cleanup crews and supplies. This did not come without sacrifice for Kathryn, who was just getting settled, then being thrown into chaos with no permanent place to live. Despite it all, she kept up with her coursework and was encouraged by seeing how God has faithfully provided for his people as they trust and obey him. We rejoiced with her as God answered prayer and provided a home and roommate for her. Praise God for our new missionaries and their willingness to say "yes" to the Lord.

Leaders Refresh

As our executive team identified needs of staff in different seasons, our team responded with Leaders Refresh for both primary caregivers who are entering back into mission after a season invested primarily with family, and staff who are in support roles who hadn't had the opportunity for field training. This short, six week training made a big difference for



this group of 22, helping them feel seen and invested in, both in their personal spiritual growth, and discovering how they can best contribute who God has made them in the missional community. They are also better appreciating those who bring expertise and skills behind the scenes in ways we can help each other as we go after the great commission together.

Maureen is helping host a youth basketball group from Zimbabwe for Total Athlete camp. Pray the spiritual content will sink in as they are integrated into training. I will be leading some of the Bible content and Natassia will help lead a small group.
